### LOOKING AHEAD

**CATHEDRAL SHOP SUMMER SALE** a starts on Monday 4 August 2008 in the Education Centre - reductions in all departments. Shop opening times Monday-Saturday 10.00am-6.00pm Sunday 12 noon -6.00pm

**DIOCESAN QUIET DAY** entitled 'Godgift' in the Cathedral on Wednesday 13 August from 10.15am-3.30pm.

**ROOF WORKS** Work to replace the tower and south transept roofs will start in the next few weeks. This is being funded by English Heritage with the Wolfson Foundation and a generous matching grant from the Weston Foundation. It is the first of a three part plan for re-roofing most of the Cathedral. A builders' compound will be erected in the south churchyard; access via the SW doors and east-west through the churchyard will however be retained.

**CATERING KIOSK** The Chapter and Board of Cathedral Enterprises have instructed Prestige Experience the Cathedral's new catering franchise holders to install a mobile catering kiosk in the south churchyard.

**PILGRIMAGE TO WALSINGHAM** the annual ecumenical day pilgrimage takes place on Saturday 20 September. Booking forms will be available soon.

**AVACANCY** for a member of the congregation has arisen on the Cathedral Chapter. Notices are at the church doors, nominations close on Sunday 7 September at 5.30pm. There will be an Extraordinary General Meeting on Sunday 21 September in the library for the single purpose of conducting the election. **SOME WATER COMPANIES** are billing churches for the amount of rainwater than runs off roofs and car parks into the sewers. This is leading to huge increases in water bills. The Cathedral is not yet affected but the impact for us could be serious.
